LOGOS offers an approach to Christian nurture designed to work in churches of all sizes and denominations, in rural areas, suburban towns, and inner cities. It is a ministry that engages young people in the life of the church by giving them opportunities to:

- ✠ Build relationships with mature Christian adults in the church.
- ✠ Experience what the early church in Acts lived out... study, fellowship, a shared meal, and the practice of worship.
- ✠ Learn and practice what it means to be a child of God and a disciple of Christ.

LOGOS goes beyond merely offering an after-school or evening program. The elements of a thriving LOGOS ministry can also be the elements that transform children and youth into life-long disciples, and transform congregations into healthy, effective bodies of Christ!

Elements of LOGOS

LOGOS builds intergenerational relationships between young people and caring, Christian adults of all ages through a four-part weekly format:

- ✠ **Bible Study:** A time for each grade, or a combination of grades, to study the Bible as the model for Christ-centered living.
- ✠ **Worship Arts:** Choir, drama, bells, or other arts are rehearsed at LOGOS and then presented regularly in corporate worship.
- ✠ **Family Time:** the shared meal is a time to gather regular "table families" of various ages who eat together each week for the entire program year. Kitchen teams prepare dinners that are served family style-with table settings and serving dishes-practicing the art of serving one another.
- ✠ **Recreation:** All have great fun in a cooperative atmosphere, often drawing on the hobbies and interests of adults in the congregation willing to share their passions on a one-time basis or longer.

LOGOS as an Intergenerational Ministry

LOGOS is dependent on at least one parent from each family enrolled investing time in the ministry. It is not a "drop off" and "pick-up" program-parents are intentionally involved which assist them in their role as primary spiritual guide for their children. Clergy and other volunteers from the church are also encouraged to serve, making this a congregational ministry.
